Location: Warman Fire Hall (501 Centennial Blvd)

To help you dispose of household hazardous waste and electronics (e-waste), the City has coordinated a Household Hazardous Waste Day. On the date listed below, a temporary site is set up at the Warman Fire Hall parking lot (501 Centennial Blvd) from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for residents of Warman to drop-off their household hazardous waste materials for recycling or safe disposal.

This event is for Warman residents only and ID is required to prove Warman residency at the gate.

NOTICE OF RESIDENTIAL ORGANICS WASTE DEPOT

Available from April 1 to November 1

This depot is for the collection of RESIDENTIAL organics – grass clippings, leaves and small tree trimmings. The bins are located on the south side of North Railway Street East [the same location as the old recycling bins].

Bins will be removed should snow arrive prior to November 1st.

As these green bins are for organics ONLY, no plastic bags will be allowed in the bin.

A separate red bin will be on site for the disposal of your plastic bags after emptying them into the green bin.

Please DO NOT drop any food waste or other waste into this bin. Food waste will attract flies and cause foul odours.

Please empty your compost items inside the bins. DO NOT THROW ITEMS ON THE GROUND OUTSIDE THE BINS.

THESE BINS ARE NOT FOR GARBAGE.

Misuse of this depot will result in fines to offenders and the removal of this service.

ALL ITEMS MUST BE OUT BY 7:00 AM OCT 3rd

City Cleanup is done in the spring and again in the fall. All acceptable items left in the alley, on the dates mentioned, will be hauled away for you by BN Steel and Metals and our Public Works Department.

Items must be ready for pickup at 7:00 am in the back alley on the first day shown for your area.

Do not place items in your alley prior to one week before we begin City Cleanup.
PROPERTIES DOING SO WILL BE SUBJECT TO BYLAW ENFORCEMENT.

Please DO NOT leave any items in the alley that you do not want picked up.

The City and BN Metals & Metals will not be responsible for any items picked up in error.

Residents with no back alley will have items picked up on the first day of the cleanup for their area. Please have your items ready by 7:00 a.m at the end of your driveway.

Leaves, garden refuse and grass clippings must be bagged.

Tree branches must be **cut in lengths no longer than four feet and tied.**

Carpet must be rolled and cut to no longer than four feet in length.

The City will not accept multiples of each appliance per home; only one of each type of appliance per home will be taken (example: 1 stove, 1 dishwasher NOT 2 stoves 3 dishwashers)

There is a limit of TWO CUBIC YARDS per house hold.

Items That Will Not Be Picked Up:

The program will not pick up the following items:

- materials from major renovations
- gyproc
- deck boards
- shingles
- railroad ties
- power poles
- sod
- tires
- concrete and rocks
- tree trunks and logs
- day to day household garbage
- motor oil (this can be taken to Household Hazardous Waste Day on October 14)
- toxic materials such as paint, chemicals, gasoline, etc (this can be taken to Household Hazardous Waste Day on October 14)
- batteries (this can be taken to Household Hazardous Waste Day on Oct 14)
- leaves and grass not in bags (can be taken to compost bins)
- branches longer than 4 feet or branches not bundled and tied (can be taken to compost bins)
- limit of two cubic yards per address

Items remaining in the alley after City Cleanup are the responsibility of the home owner to cleanup.

Failure to pick up items remaining in the alley after City Cleanup is over will result in the resident being charged a fine of \$200. (Bylaw 2006-01)
